# **Trademark Camping**

The message of the Gospel is just as relevant today as it was the first day Jesus proclaimed, "The time has come. The kingdom of God is near. Repent and believe the good news!" Mark 1:15

Two millennia ago, God revealed the fruition of his redemptive plan for mankind. Since that time, the Church has grown and spread the message of the gospel to every continent, every country, and almost every language on earth. According to globalfrontiermissions.org, there are only 189 unreached people groups left on the planet. Most of these are hard-to-reach tribes in remote jungled islands in the Pacific and Indian Oceans. For decades, missionaries around the world have been deliberately advancing the Kingdom (Matthew 11:12) for the purpose of closing the gap and ensuring that every nation and every tribe (Revelation 7:9) has received the Good News of Jesus Christ. We at TM Camping are doing our part too.

Since 1938, our camping ministries have existed for this very purpose. Though many of our guests come to camp having already heard the message of the gospel of peace (Ephesians 6:15), camp is one of the places where many more hear the message and respond to it for the very first time. Certainly some respond to the message of repentance

again (Matthew 4:17), even year after year, though they have previously heard and accepted it.

Oftentimes, camp is the place where God uses the "mountaintop experience" (which He invented, Exodus 19, 1 Kings 19, Matthew 17) to get His children's attention. For whatever reason, camp just works!

As you read through this report of 2023, you'll see some interesting things. Most of our camps persevered through some significant challenges. Some went through leadership transitions that were absolutely critical to the future success of the ministry. Most experienced some sort of major weather event. Some camps experienced multiple weather events (a blizzard and a hurricane) in the same year. Most of the properties experienced significant damage and loss of property. And almost all of our camps were adversely affected by the closures and repairs resulting from the storms. All of our ministries were impacted significantly by the challenges of 2023. You'll see that in the numbers and details.

But at the same time, there were some amazing wins in 2023 too.

We brought in new leadership at Tonto Rim that quickly built up the year-round team and increased ministry by over 20% above our projections. Rock-N-Water was able to procure a new 40-passenger bus, while also receiving a 25-passenger shuttle bus as a donation, to meet their ever-growing need to accommodate and transport more campers to outdoor adventures.



Santa Barbara Christian Camp (previously San Marcos) received over \$300,000 in gifts, and was able to rebuild the cabin that was lost in the spring storms, repave the drive into camp, reroof almost every building in need, and remodel the kitchen, complete with a brand-new walk-in refrigerator.

Our Outdoor Science Schools saw more campers than ever before, and for the first time since the introduction of COVID, we had enough staff to adequately run the programs for over 5,400 campers. Thousand Pines also received large gifts in 2023, including a couple of estate gifts, and reported over 500 first-time decisions in one summer season. Lake Gregory saw over 85,000 beach-going guests and served our community over 1000 Thanksgiving meals with the help of our local churches and Rotary club. We also served over 200 senior citizens lunch every week of the year, through partnership with Leisure Shores Senior Center.

All-in-all, TM Camping experienced some incredible blessings as we lived out our purpose in 2023, despite the many difficult challenges in this ministry. God has been abundantly faithful in supporting, sustaining, and blessing these Gospel ministries. You'll see some of those details in this report, too. Jesus said, "Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me does not welcome me, but the one who sent me." For this reason, we persevered because He called us to.








#### TMC EMPLOYEES - PEAK SEASON









#### **INCOME HISTORY - \$113,935,957 SUM OF INCOME**

















Along with the staff transition, we have remodeled Dogwood, our newest leadership housing; developed our entrance; and are planning a new welcome center for our guests. Our goal is to enhance the customer experience from the


moment they drive through the entrance on Friday, until they leave on Sunday.



# **Outdoor Education**







#### **History of TM Camping**

Trademark Camping was born as a nonprofit entity in 2023. But our history goes way back to 1938, when Thousand Pines Baptist Camp was established. If you want to wind even further back, clock the year 1895, when a group of Baptist churches in Southern California formed the Southern California Baptist Convention (SCBC).

TONTO RIM

Prior to 1938, Thousand Pines property was owned by Arthur Gregory, a citrus farmer in Redlands, as a logging camp to build orange crates. Later, he used it to house all of the workers who built Lake Gregory, a project and vision initiated by Gregory. Being a devout Christian, he donated the property to the SCBC to be used as a baptist camp.

The SCBC family of churches eventually grew into American Baptist Churches of the Pacific Southwest (ABCPSW) in 1977, which later became Transformation Ministries (TM) in 2006. Over many years, the TM organization's camping ministry adopted several properties and programs dedicated to helping campers experience God. Last year, Transformation Ministries branched into Aspire Network (for churches) and TM Camping gained ownership of Thousand Pines, San Marcos Christian Camp (Now Santa Barbara Christian Camp), Tonto Rim Christian Camp, Rock-N-Water, and a group of outdoor education programs including our newly rebranded American Outdoor Education.




# **Rock-N-Water**

# Santa Barbara

2023 opened with a surprising crash of destruction. We literally lost a complete cabin. Rain, wind, and storm wreaked havoc on Santa Barbara Christian Camp (formerly San Marcos) in the opening weeks. Mud slides, debris flow, rockslides, flooding, road erosion and complete collapses, along with the county's confusing road closure signs, and Google Maps' incorrect digital road closure markers, all appeared to be massive obstacles to our mission to help people see, know, and experience God.

God showed up in so many unexpected ways. Unexpected financial gifts allowed us to rent equipment and manpower to begin removing mud, rocks, and debris. These same gifts allowed us to repave the worst sections of our road. Volunteers came from far and wide, including nearby churches, to paint and dig fire clearances around buildings. Campers offered their time to help, even while they were guests. Students from the Master's University came to serve. Even our county made incredible progress rebuilding the roads. After a short closure, by God's grace we were able to reopen camp and minister to so many.

God brought a special projects coordinator to the team, Jay Carrier, who was instrumental in designing our new Bunkhouse, a gorgeous, deluxe, hotel-style leadership accommodation. Another unexpected blessing was the arrival of David Eggli, a skilled contractor who began donating every Friday to serve at camp. Because of their work, we are thrilled to share that the cabin we lost in January was rebuilt before the year's end. Praise the Lord! We're also excited to announce that we will be welcoming Christian Mendoza and family from Thousand Pines to the family at Santa Barbara Christian Camp. We are excited to have his skill, enthusiasm, and focus. As an added blessing, we ended the year with an unexpected \$20,000 gift.

The new year marks a significant transition for us, as we move ahead under a new name. Since 1956, the name San Marcos has served locals for the cause of Christ. Our reach has grown to so many beyond the Santa Barbara area. Judging from the number of inquiries we've received, more and more people assume we are located in San Marcos, CA, near San Diego. This confusion has been a serious issue related to booking groups and recruiting staff. We are excited that "relaunching" as Santa Barbara Christian Camp will immediately solve the location confusion, as well as add an attractive bonus: the appeal of Santa Barbara itself. Please pray for wisdom as we advocate the many facets and details involved with rebranding.

God was faithful to carry us through 2023, and we are certain that He will continue to do so in 2024.



Lake Gregory Regional Park is a tourist magnet and thus the main income driver for Crestline and surrounding areas. That central position gives us a city-on-a-hill sort of status, and a platform to be a light in our community. Ministry looks a little different at Lake Gregory, but I understand now just how broad our audience is and the powerful impact we can have.

We live in a very diverse community. We have a strong group of churches that work well together for the body of Christ. We also have a lot of indifferents, and even a few satanists. The lake as a central meeting place of economic importance gives us the opportunity to love them all as we're called to do. They work for us, they attend events here, they visit the lake, they partner with us in community meetings.

Over the past few years, wages have increased dramatically, and we've learned that with government-regulated pricing we simply cannot keep up with runaway wage increases. From day one, we've cared about staff culture, and even designed the most robust staff benefits program anywhere in our area. Being a great place to work and providing unique staff experiences has helped us hang on to our outstanding team.

One part of caring for staff was making sure that our managers were "frontline leaders." That means we don't need open door policies or mandatory fun days, because our leadership teams are on the frontlines, having fun and talking with staff as they work shoulder-to-shoulder.

Running a regional park and central tourist destination has opened government doors in wonderful ways. We get to have ministry impact, although subtle at times, inside government circles across the county and with local elected officials.


As the head of Lake Gregory Company, I don't get to be explicit about sharing the gospel with our staff, but as the song says, "They will know we are Christians by our love." That works on a lot of levels. I sit on various community boards and committees and interact weekly with various government officials and daily with our staff, one of whom was recently baptized.
